"Fatal Dose: The Tragic Story of Sulfanilamide"

ntroduced in the 1930s, sulfanilamide was one of the first effective antibiotics. It was used to treat bacterial infections, including streptococcal infections

The Disaster;

Reformulation with Diethylene Glycol:

In 1937, a company called S.E. Massengill Co. reformulated sulfanilamide into a liquid form for easier administration. To make the drug palatable, they used diethylene glycol (DEG) as a solvent.

DEG is a colourless, odourless liquid that is toxic to humans. It was used because it was cheap and could dissolve the sulfanilamide effectively.

Toxicity and Reactions:

The reformulated drug, marketed as "Elixir Sulfanilamide," was distributed in large quantities. Shortly after the drug was introduced, reports began to emerge of patients experiencing severe poisoning symptoms. Symptoms included kidney failure, severe abdominal pain, and vomiting.

By the time the problem was identified, over 100 people had died from acute kidney failure and other complications related to DEG poisoning.

Investigations and Findings:

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) launched an investigation. They found that DEG was responsible for the severe adverse effects and deaths.

It became clear that the drug had not been properly tested for safety and that DEG was not intended for human consumption.

Impact are

Legal and Regulatory Changes:

The sulfanilamide disaster highlighted the

need for stronger regulatory oversight. At that time, drug safety regulations were minimal. In response to the tragedy, the U.S. Congress passed the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act of 1938. This landmark legislation required: Pre-market Approval: Manufacturers had to prove the safety of new drugs before they could be marketed. Labelling Requirements: Drugs had to be accurately labelled with all ingredients and potential side effects. Good Manufacturing Practices: Standards were set to ensure the quality and safety of drugs during production.

FDAAuthority:

The Act gave the FDA more authority to regulate drug safety and recall unsafe products.

Legacy:

The sulfanilamide disaster is often cited as a pivotal event that shaped modern drug regulation. It led to the establishment of more rigorous drug testing and approval processes, which have helped prevent similar tragedies in the future.

Penicillin: The Mold that Rocked






How penicillin became a superhero drug

Plot twist: This mold wasn't just chilling-it was killing bacteria nearby then he realised; this could be useful against infections?"

Little did Fleming know, he'd just discovered the world's first antibiotic.

How does it work: The OG use:

Penicillin is a beta-lactam antibiotic , it :

Side-effects :



information to help pharmaceutical companies select the compound or compounds with the greatest potential to be developed into safe and effective medicines.

Step 5: Preclinical Testing

Pre-clinical research in drug development process involves evaluation of drug's safety and efficacy in animal

species that concludes the prospective human outcome.

The pre-clinical trials can be conducted in two way

- General Pharmacological
- Toxicology

It is essential to explore unwanted pharmacological effects in

suitable animal models and monitoring them in toxicological studies.

Step 6: Clinical Research

Clinical trials are conducted in people (volunteer)and intended to answer specific questions about the safety and efficacy of drugs, vaccines, other therapies, or new methods of using current treatments.

Clinical trials follow a specific study protocol that is designed by the researcher or investigator or manufacturer.



Step /: New Drug Application

A New Drug Application (NDA) expresses the full story of a drug molecule. Its purpose is to verify that a drug is safe and effective for its proposed use in the people studied.

All clinical data were submitted to regulatory authorities, such as the FDA or EMA, for review. After rigorous evaluation, the drug was approved for use, with manufacturing and quality control processes ensuring safety and consistency.

Step 8: Medication Rollout




