Industrial Tour Report 2025

The Institute of Pharmacy and Research, Badnera, organized an industrial and educational tour for final-year B. Pharm and M. Pharm students from **28th January to 6th February 2025**. Our Respected Principal **Prof. (Dr.) S. J. Dighade** sir graciously came to bid farewell to the students of B. Pharm and M. Pharm who were departing for their much-anticipated industrial tour. This gesture of encouragement and support was warmly welcomed by both students and faculty members. The tour aimed to provide students with practical exposure to pharmaceutical industries, enhance their understanding of manufacturing processes, and offer cultural and historical enrichment. A total of 33 students and 3 faculty members, including Mr. S. G. Bonde and Ms. V. R. Belokar, participated in this insightful journey.

The tour commenced with an early departure from Badnera Railway Station on 28th January, where students boarded the Gondwana Express to Delhi. The journey was filled with enthusiasm as students engaged in discussions about the upcoming industrial visits. Upon reaching Delhi on 29th January, the group explored key landmarks, including India Gate, Lotus Temple, Red Fort, and Akshardham Temple, followed by shopping at Sarojini Nagar Market. The day concluded with an overnight train journey to Amritsar.

On 30th January, the group arrived in Amritsar and visited significant sites such as the Punjab State War Heroes' Memorial, Wagah Border for the flag ceremony, Jallianwala Bagh, and the Golden Temple. The spiritual and historical experiences left a lasting impression on the students. The next day, 31st January, the industrial segment began with a visit to Preet Remedies Pvt. Ltd. in Baddi, where students observed pharmaceutical manufacturing processes, quality control, and GMP compliance. Later, they traveled to Chandigarh, exploring the Rock Garden and local markets before proceeding towards Manikaran.

The tour continued with a visit to Manikaran Sahib on 1st February, where students experienced the serene hot springs and spiritual ambiance. They then proceeded to Kullu for river rafting and a visit to a shawl factory, followed by an evening transfer to Manali. The next day, 2nd February, was dedicated to adventure at Hampta Pass Snow Point, where students enjoyed skiing, trekking, and snow activities. On 3rd February, the group explored Manali's local attractions, including Vashisht Temple, Hidimba Devi Temple, Tibetan Monastery, and Mall Road.

The return journey began on **5th February**, with the group traveling back to Delhi and then boarding a train to Nagpur.
